From Pastor David:

Dear Saints of St. Peter's:

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Easter is not a one-day celebration. The resurrection of Jesus is our defining event. It is our primary confession. Jesus' defeat of sin and death on the cross gives us hope today, tomorrow, and every day of our lives.

In the Gospel of John, the disciples are huddled in fear on the first Easter evening. The women have told them the good news of Jesus' resurrection. Clearly, they do not fully comprehend what the women are telling them.

They locked the doors for fear of the Jews. But fear and locked doors cannot keep Jesus away. Jesus shows up, greets them with his peace, and he shows them his hands.

We have our own fears. You might be fearful of the lab results from the doctor's office. You might be fearful that your efforts to keep your marriage intact will not succeed. People have knocked on the wrong door and gotten shot, makes is painfully aware that shootings can and do happen anywhere.

The risen Jesus didn't come to his disciple like a GQ model. His wounds did not miraculously heal or disappear. Wounded, Jesus appeared before his disciples. Jesus sends you and me out into the world wounded. Jesus does not expect or require us to first clean up our act or resolve all our issues. We all have baggage and imperfect histories. The church is not a perfect community or institution. We have differing and competing opinions. Yet, we are called

to love one another for who we are-not who we could be.

The Easter message is that our sin and brokenness do not define us. We are forgiven and loved by Jesus who defeated sin and death on the cross. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

MUSIC NOTES

This month, we are wrapping up another year of making music together! I'd like to take a moment and thank all of St. Peter's musicians. Our bell choir and worship choir members are very committed and a joy to direct. Did you realize that there is room for new members? Let me explain:

- We have enough bells for 12 people to ring. We have been playing with 8 ringers for the past year.
- The number of singers needed for a choir is limitless.
 There are basically four sections in our choir. Men and women each split between higher range and lower range. This past year we have had 6 men and 10 women, all divided evenly.



For the bells: If you have ever participated in a band (even junior high!), taken piano lessons, or read music in a choir — then you would be able to play in the handbell choir. All it takes is knowing how to follow along with

music, and watching where to play your two bells in that music. The Jubilee Bells practice at 4:30 on Wednesdays during the school year, and just play one Sunday a month in the church service. If the time of day is what keeps you from joining, talk to me! I want to have bells available for all interested.

For the choir: If you have ever enjoyed singing in a choir – maybe high school, maybe in a community theater production – then perhaps you should give St.



Peter's choir a try! If you aren't comfortable reading music – you can still be a singer in the choir! Not everyone is a "soloist" in our group. We have leaders and we have those who sing by listening and following the leaders! Every member of the choir is an important part of the group. We meet at 7 pm on Wednesdays, and typically sing at 2 services each month.

We have other music opportunities at St. Peter's as well – let me know if you'd be interested in being part of the worship band or the gospel band!

Jubilee Bells and Worship Choir meet from September to May. I have a schedule made up well in advance, so you can plan accordingly. I also have an "absent" list for when you know you will be unavailable. There are no "three strikes" rules! We have a lot of fun and laughs, but the musicians would also tell you that these groups become a support for each other.

As Michon Weeks, who sings alto in the Worship Choir stated, "Singing in St. Peter's choir brings me joy. Our repertoire includes songs that express deep spiritual realities, and singing these ideas out loud with others creates a powerful experience that resonates with my soul. The choir is more than just a group of singers - it is a community that shows up for one another during challenging times, whether it be a hospital visit or the loss of a family member. Members offer help, tears, food, and prayers, demonstrating the true meaning of compassion and support." A recent article I read reenforced this, "The church choir serves as a small group within the church for faith formation."

Will you consider giving the bell choir or the worship choir a try?


