Happenings at St. Peter's

Stewardship Sunday

November and stewardship go together like ... well, æbleskiver and jam.

For the second consecutive year, St. Peter's marked the congregation's Stewardship Sunday with an æbleskiver breakfast served in the Fellowship Hall after the Nov. 17 worship service. More than 70 people lined up for plates of three spherical Danish, pancake-like treats sprinkled with powdered sugar and served with a dollop of fruit jam. Organizers nearly ran out of batter serving roughly the same number of people last year. They were better prepared for the turnout this time. Organizers Polly and David Hendee made seven triple batches of batter to ensure there would be enough æbleskiver for everyone. Cooks JoAnne Olson, Kirsten Thompson and the Hendees kept four æbleskiver pans busy during the morning. Evonne Clay, Sheryl Kleppe and Jolene Manzey worked the serving window. Why æbleskiver? The congregation has Danish roots. St. Peter's Evangelical Lutheran Church was founded in Northfield by Danish immigrants in November 1893 when 28 members — about the number of people who linger after church for coffee hour now — signed the charter. After initially meeting in homes, their first church was in what is now the Northfield Arts Guild building across town on Third Street. The congregation started constructing the current church in 1958. Worship started here in 1963.



Music Notes By Mary Kay Bougie

St. Peter's is using a new Advent-Epiphany series. Beginning on December 1st, you will notice quilt patterns used in the bulletin, a take-home devotional booklet, an Advent calendar (found as an insert in this newsletter), and in the sanctuary. Throughout the season, the writers of this series were inspired by the storied tradition of quilting.

Each week, a new pattern will represent the themes:



Advent 1: You are a Blessing

Advent 2: We Can't Go Alone

Advent 3: Do the Good That is Yours to Do

Advent 4: Hope is Worth the Risk

Christmas Eve: Love Knows Your Name

Christmastide: Don't Forget to Laugh

Epiphany: The Road Isn't Straight

Here is an introduction of the series, from the writers: "Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

Produced by A Sanctified Art, our Advent series is filled with blessings, with the scriptures and reminders we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. These reminders root us in the fundamental truths of our faith. Many of them are life lessons we teach to children—lessons that adults continue to learn and relearn. They may resemble the blessings we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies like weddings, graduations, or baptisms. And so, we invite you to move through this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

As you journey through this season, may you find words for belovedness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, love is your beginning."

Council Highlights

To express God's love and grace in building a community where people **believe** in God, **belong** to Christ, and **become** disciples who serve in day-to-day living.

Call to Order: Kleppe called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. in the Fireside Room.

Devotion: Pastor showed a brief video about the work Lutheran World Relief is doing in the aftermath of the recent hurricane flooding in western North Carolina. Quilts — like those made by the congregation's LUV Quilters — and personal-care kits have been godsends to displaced people who lost everything.

Reports

Pastor: Several people have mentioned that they are not hearing well during worship. Two letters have been mailed to congregation members on behalf of the Stewardship Team seeking their participation in making estimates of giving for 2025. The Confirmation J-Term kickoff is Nov. 13 at St. John's Lutheran. Bethel and St. John's congregation members will be coming to St. Peter's for the annual Thanksgiving Eve worship and PieFest. The Lessons & Carols worship and the Sunday School Christmas program will be combined for the Dec. 15 worship service. The Faith Formation ministry team will coordinate hot chocolate and a bake sale during the Dec.15 fellowship hour. Proceeds will go to a charity.

Council President: Kleppe renewed the annual lease with Sarah's House, a transitional facility for women. The house currently is full with five residents. Kleppe and Kopack inspected the two, old basement sump pumps at Sarah's House. One is dead. Kopack will replace both in the next few weeks.

Treasurer: Olson said income is basically matching expenses, but cautioned that it's far short of covering budgeted expenses — which include an unfilled staff position. Olson and Kleppe will work on a 2025 budget for presentation to the Council at its December meeting. The Personnel Committee will meet to consider staff compensation for 2025.

Committees

Signage: The Council inspected new signs in the south wing offices and set a tentative goal of completing others elsewhere in the church next year in coordination with possible narthex renovations.

Faith Formation: The Faith Formation team is starting GroupMe App groups for SPY, Confirmation and Sunday school in hopes of having better attendance at activities. Team members will look into the Sunday school milestones at other Lutheran congregations.

New Business: Phyllis Swanson requested the Mission Endowment Fund send \$1,000 to Lutheran Bible Translators. Kleppe will ask Swanson to put her request in writing to the MEF for its consideration.

Cub Scouts: A request for permission to use the church Fellowship Hall and a few Sunday school rooms as meeting places was tabled pending more information.

Continuing Education: Pastor will enroll in the Discernment Program through LeaderWise. The program helps pastors determine the best career and personal choices, given their gifts, passions and stage of their ministries.

Adjournment: Motion by Olson and second by Eaves to adjourn at 8:32 p.m. Approved, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
