September is the de facto beginning of a new year. Children and youth will soon be back to school. Here in the church, Sunday School, Confirmation, SPY, Worship Choir, and Jubilee Bells will return.

Worship is central to the Christian faith. When we "remember the sabbath and keep it holy" (3rd commandment), we also strive to keep other gods from becoming God in our life (1st Commandment).

As we begin a "new year", I invite, encourage, and challenge you to make worship a priority in your life.

Worship seems to have become optional for many Christians. The Christian church now has competition on Sunday mornings that we did not have thirty and fifty years ago. We travel more than people did a couple generations ago. Children/Youth sports schedule practices and games on Sunday mornings. When considering when to schedule an event on a weekend, I have heard people say, "How about Sunday morning? Nothing else is happening on Sunday mornings."

For Christians, Sunday morning is sabbath-a time dedicated to worship and rest.

I used this quote from Richard Rohr on August 18: We don't think ourselves into a new way of living. We live ourselves into a new way of thinking.

If you think that you'll start worshiping more regularly after you feel closer to God, you may be in for a long wait. It is in worship where we hear God's Word read and proclaimed, sing hymns, confess our sins and hear we are forgiven, pray, and connect with fellow Christians that we experience the presence of God.

Worship does not satisfy our hunger for God – it whets our appetite. – Eugene Peterson

Life is challenging and difficult, and full of obstacles. We experience pain and disappointment, and we can get disoriented. We're busy–some of us, too busy. Worship is a gift from God.

In worship we connect with God who in Christ Jesus loves, forgives, and redeems us. The Christian faith is not a solitary relationship between you and Jesus. Christianity is lived in a community that worships and prays, laughs and cries, eats and drinks, works and plays together.

Happenings at St. Peter's

Church Council Initiative

The first stage of a Church Council initiative to update signage in and around the church is complete. Each of the church's seven doors now feature large, white numerals.

Not only are they useful for the staff and members to tell visitors which door to enter, but they are important to direct rescue squad, fire and police responders.

The doors are numbered clockwise 1 through 7 around the church. The parking lot door at the southwest corner of the church is numbered 1. Door 2 is the north door in the narthex. Doors 3 and 4 are exit doors off the altar and sacristry. Door 5 is the east door near the elevator. Door 6 is the south door to the church offices. Door 7 is the parking lot atrium door to the Fellowship Hall and kitchen.

In addition to numerals, Door 1 is marked as "Sanctuary Entrance," Door 6 is marked "Church Offices" and Door 7 is marked "Fellowship Hall & Kitchen."

Planning is underway to improve interior signs.

Council Highlights

To express God's love and grace in building a community where people **believe** in God, **belong** to Christ, and **become** disciples who serve in day-to-day living.

Before the meeting was called to order, Patrick Bougie, chairman of the Narthex Committee and the self-described de facto church architect, updated the Council on the committee's review of ways to refresh the function and appearance of the narthex. Bougie presented a draft "laundry list" of things that might need to be addressed. Bougie said the "bones of the church" are in "really good shape." The church's Mid-century Modern architecture is a beautiful style. "We want to respect that." There is no project time schedule or cost estimate yet. "Until the (second-floor) bathrooms are paid for we can't move into another construction project," said Phil Olson, treasurer.

Devotion: Kleppe read a short passage from "Be Still," about how to listen to God and remember who is in charge.

Approval of Minutes: Motion by Paulson, second by Bleckwehl to approve minutes of the July 9 meeting. Approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor: No report. Pastor is on vacation.

Council President: The church's job listing for a Christian Life Coordinator has been revised to add a preferred requirement that applicants have a bachelor's degree. The advertisements also have been sent to area Lutheran seminaries and colleges. Council members asked that a wider net be cast and that the advertisement be posted at many more colleges and universities in the area.

Treasurer: No report. The church's financial administrator has been on vacation. Olson will provide a report via email as soon as he receives July financial information from the financial administrator. Good Earth Village will continue to receive the congregation's Sunday loose-change offerings in the Change 4 Change initiative during August. The September recipients will be Sarah's House/Ruth's House.

Committee Reports

Capital Improvement: Work is underway on the second-floor restroom renovations. Contractor Schmidt Homes' goal is to finish by the end of August.

Signage: Bleckwehl noted that the exterior doors have been numbered for public safety reasons. She is working on cost estimates to improve interior signs.

Stewardship: No new fundraising total for the \$33,000 capital improvement project (second-floor restrooms) via special offerings from the congregation is available. The June total was \$10,000. A Fruity French Toast fundraiser is planned during Rally Sunday, Sept. 15.

New Business: Mary Peterson will join Kleppe, Paulson and Weeks to serve on a committee to create a vision statement for the congregation. Tentative plans for Rally Sunday activities were discussed. Volunteers will be needed.
